1. **Welcome:** Joy welcomed all to the meeting.
2. **Attendance/Roll Call:** Joy C.- Acting Chair, Kelly H. – 15th F.W., Jessie S. – 6th St. Thomas, Bill T.- Camp Warden, Susan M. – 178th/Dog Lake, Kim L.- 12th P.A., Darlene A. – Grey Wolf, Roberta W.- Grey Wolf Booking
3. **Scouters Five:** Keep Scouter Bill Towill in our thoughts and prayers for a full healing.
4. **Approval of Agenda:** Approved by all in attendance.
5. **Approval of Previous Minutes:** Moved by Roberta, Seconded by Darlene to accept previous minutes.
6. **Business arising from the Minutes:** We are in need of Porta Potties at Grey Wolf; this was discussed by Bill Towill at previous meetings with Kelly given the job to obtain quotes. The idea was to look at purchasing 4, placing them onto a concrete slab, build walls and roof around them as you see at Vickers's Park. These 4 units would replace the 8 units that were removed. Two quotes were received as follows:
 - a. GFL Environmental – to rent 2 regular Units is \$170.00 + HST per unit per month, and 2 Wheelchair Accessible is \$200.00 each + HST, to rent these from June to Sept would cost us a total of \$3344.80 which includes cleaning services. Purchasing the units is an option but according to them not cost effective as they do not have any Wheelchair accessible units for sale, and they stated the cost would amount to the same each season as the cost to buy and service would be about the same amount.
 - b. A-1 Sewage Services (1989) Ltd. – says units will sell for \$400.00 each +HST, service on said units would be \$50.00 per unit + HST, as needed when needed Monday to Friday. To purchase a Wheelchair accessible unit is \$900.00 + HST same price to service unit the single units.
 - Lots of discussion took place around this purchase, with many feeling that we need to request funds from Scouts Canada as this is a necessary need.
 - Kelly reported she did a camp in March had 35 youth and adults out and the one bathroom by pole barn was not enough and the others further down the road was not feasible to send Beaver or Cub aged youth to in the middle of the winter with no lighting on the road during the night.
 - We have a spring camp happening in June where there will be at least 140 bodies camping on the field we need the extra bathrooms before that camp, it would be a total waist of funds to rent them when those funds could go towards purchasing them.
 - It was mentioned that we only purchase 2 regular units and one Wheelchair accessible unit.

- The present outhouse by the Pole Barn is Wheelchair accessible; do we really need another on as a port potty? We could make a proper walkway from the road to this bathroom making it easier accessible to all and stick with purchasing 4 regular units.
 - c. **This has been deferred to next month's Area Meeting on May 17th, giving Roberta W. time to contact Bruce Hole on the issue on how to request funds for this need.** Kelly did warn all that it is the season for events around the city to rent them so we face the possibility that we may not get any for when we need them which would be a disaster for our Spring Camp in June.
7. **Area Support Manager (Dawn Brown):** Roberta, Joy and Kelly attended a conference call with Don McDonald, Dawn Brown, Clinton Christenson and Kenny (Youth Council), on Tuesday April 4/17, as well as a meeting with Dawn and Clinton on Wed April 5/17. We discussed health and strength of Scouting in Thunder Bay, with many options discussed on how to effectively advertize, help in recruiting Volunteers in Scouting:
- a. **Advertizing in the Key again** – Joy is looking into this and costs
 - b. **Volunteers Thunder Bay.com** – Roberta reported it will cost \$200.00 to register, plus we have to work so many of their fundraisers which we get no money raised and pay additional fees, and many more requirements. It was decided this was not feasible.
 - c. **Advertizing in Coffee Talk** – Kelly sent out a request on costs but have not heard back.
 - d. **Magic 99 on the ad's they ran for us**– Kelly sent the person who recorded and handled the ad an email again no answer yet.
 - e. **Advertizing on Kijiji**, paying the small fee to keep our ad on top as this is well used by many. Girl Guides uses this form of Advertizing. Kelly has not had time to get prices.
 - f. **Recruitment of Volunteers Day** – Kelly mentioned it would be nice to have a day where people could come hear about being a Scouter, maybe have Scouters attend with a lap top where we could sit with possible recruits to show them how to go about registering and finding the training needed etc.
 - g. **Recruit a Volunteer Day is tentatively set for Sept 9, 2017, 1pm to 4pm:** Roberta is checking the availability of the Moose Hall on Fort William Rd for the event, Kelly will do up poster to post on Kijiji and other places, Dawn Brown will come to Thunder Bay to talk to those who attend. More information will follow.

David Chezzi would like to know how and where Council can help us & what Support is needed here in Thunder Bay? Group need help in recruiting Adult Volunteers so that we can accept new youth members, to grow Scouting in Thunder Bay, strengthen the established groups that do presently exist by doing a City Wide recruitment of Volunteers & have Council work with the possible new volunteers to make it a smooth

- h. process from start to finish, which would help those already struggling to stay afloat.
 - i. **David is looking for Area Commissioner for Thunder Bay Area:** he hopes to have one in place by September. If anyone has anyone in mind be it a fellow Scouter, Friend or Parent forward the names to David and he will handle it from there.
 - j. **Don McDonald reported** there are only two Council's that are 97% ready to serve and NWO is one of them, congratulation's. Don is happy to hear that.
 - k. **David will be in Thunder Bay May 8th to May 12th, 2017**
8. **Area Group Reports:**
- a. **6th St. Thomas-** 13 cubs, 4 Scouters but 1 scouter is leaving. Last cub meeting for her is April 20,2017 and she will be going on a five month hiking expedition starting from Washington State to California. She will keep in touch with our group so that cubs can witness her experience and pin point her experience.

We finally managed to go on an ice fishing trip- with 4 cubs participating. No fish, but had a great outdoor adventure.

April 1 – Safe knife handling course a great success out at Grey Wolf. We also had a refresher course for the youth that took the course last year. The afternoon was fun and games, making stretchers with poles and lashing and having races in the snow. We will be starting on canoe training this Thursday with rules and regulations and will have a Canoe training session at Churchill pool this Sunday.

We did a hike to Cascades park last Thursday and will be going on a hike to mission marsh to identify trees, birds, plants, etc.. We will also have a bike hike at the end of May.

Plans are underway for our from the BSA pack 582 in July.

b. 15th Fort William:

- Beavers have been very busy with touring, Terry Fox Monument, Conservation Area, and wood building projects at Home Depot. Upcoming they have a tour of the Friendship Garden's and will be building a Garden Project in which our Sponsor has approved it to be on the Church Property, the Garden Project will house beautiful flowers and plants and such. We have 3 Beavers preparing to move up to cubs.
- Cubs have also been busy and attended the Home Depot wood building project; our Scouts did a planned Easter Egg Hunt for the cubs which was tons of fun, they worked on finishing up many badges that were touched on over the course of the year. All enjoy our monthly birthday party, and Akela's Store.
- Scouts have worked on knots, compass work, built Para Cord Bracelets, and hosted an Easter Egg Hunt for the Cubs. Linking has been going on with 4 cubs preparing to move up to Scouts in the New Year.
- Venturers have worked along with the Scout Troop due to only have 3 Scouts and 3 Venturers.
- We have gotten many inquiries for next year's Scouting and have had some visits by youth happening.
- Our Group is gearing up for Scoutree's Pledging, with envelopes sent home for the month of April with all youth, then a night of going door to door in our area, to having two Saturdays booked at Shoppers and Dollarama on Edward St in May.
- We have been planning and working on the Spring Camp activities and we are pleased to say it is all coming together nicely, we feel the kids attending will have loads of fun.
