

We continue to proclaim the Good News of Easter, because Easter is not just a day but a season. In fact, it's an eternity. An unknown author once wrote these words:

"Blessed are those to whom Easter is not a hunt but a find;
Not a greeting but a proclamation;

And that is exactly what the Resurrection has given us—new light, new hope, new joy!

But God has helped us to persevere, and we are now, sometimes through tears of joy, expressing that roar of relief and exhilaration. It is a new beginning for us now. The Resurrection tells us that Jesus, the living Lord, is on the move, and we are called to follow in His footsteps. We bring the good news to others by the proclamation of our words and by our actions. Let's not lose our vision.

My grand-daughter, Jazlyn Joy, is someone who brings hope into my life. She is my little angel of encouragement for a brighter future. Whenever I feel down or discouraged, I think of her. She is also an absolute bundle of energy. She is so filled with excitement and enthusiasm. I wish I could somehow bottle it and give us all a 'Jazzy shot' of exhilaration. She jumps out of her 'big girl bed' every morning with her two feet planted firmly on the floor and says, "Okay! Okay!" It's a new day and she's on a mission. We too have a mission ahead of us. There's no time to waste. Emma Woodhall-Bache once wrote:

"I love the sweet smell of dawn— Our unique daily opportunity to smell time, To smell opportunity— Each morning being a new beginning."

If you want to come here for lunch after church, press 8.


If you need money, press 9.
