Before we speak or act, may we seriously ask ourselves ... "Is this how I would want someone to treat me?" Help us to extend to others the kind of love, concern, and mercy that You always have for us. In Jesus Name, I pray. Amen.



A new Lenten Book Study begins Wednesday, March 7th from 7:00—9:00 p.m. in the Education Centre. This is a 5-week study of the book "God: The Rumours Persist! I love that expression — "Do the math!" It's helped me on more than one occasion to look with more 'realistic' eyes. People are often surprised when I tell them how nervous I am when I sing and play. But I'm getting better and my fear is less intense than it used to be. God has helped me 'do the math' so to speak. Let me explain.

Years ago, I played the music for the Evening Service at another church we were attending. Each week I would fret so much about it that I would become nauseous and have trouble breathing. During the service, I would get 'the look' from someone whenever I played a wrong note. After the service, others would complement me on a job well done, but all I would remember were the wrong notes I had played. Eventually, I couldn't handle it anymore and I quit playing at that service. Sadly, I didn't 'do the math.' I had played a few wrong notes, yes—but I had also played hundreds of right notes. My near-sightedness had gotten in the way of seeing the far scope of what God was wanting for me.

Deep down inside, I felt that I wasn't good enough, or worthy enough, or holy enough to be playing and singing in church, so that must be why it's not working out for me. And so, I stepped back from doing what God was calling me to do. In retrospect, I now know that this was wrong. God had given me a gift, but I had allowed fear to take over. I was listening to the wrong voices, and the worst one was my own voice pulling me down. I had to change on the inside before change would happen on the outside. I had yet to understand the challenging and convicting words in the book of James: "It is sin to know what you ought to do and then not do it." (James 4: 17). I hadn't 'done the math'.

Pastor Joel Osteen says, "You may be trying to live in victory, trying to be successful...But you are negative toward yourself. You don't feel good about who you are. You're constantly dwelling on your past hurts and pains. Until you are willing to let go of those offenses and start focusing on your new possibilities, they will tie you down right where you are. You cannot have a bad attitude toward yourself and expect to have God's best. Quit focusing on what you've done wrong. God has already rolled away your reproach—your shame, embarrassment, failures, and setbacks. God has done His part. Now you must do your part. Let it go so you can go into your Promised Land. Start thinking, feeling, and speaking positively about yourself...Declare affirmations such as 'I have a bright future. I am gifted. I am talented. People like me. I have the favor of God."

So, the next time we feel God calling us to do something, let's not feel disqualified because of our past, but let's believe that we're forgiven and restored and that God has a new plan for us. Let us shake those feelings of timidness and insecurity and believe that God is ordering our steps. We must believe with all our hearts that God has gifted us, chosen us, equipped us, and anointed us to do His work. When doubt and fear rear their ugly head, just 'do the math' and say, "Here I am Lord, I'm ready and available!"
