Parish Executive has begun the planning to bring the rectory next to the church into good repair in order to enhance and protect our equity in the property. In addition to having a professional building assessment, Ken Koza has been appointed as Project Manager to ensure all necessary work is done in a cost-effective and timely manner. The exact work required is being determined by Executive and Ken this week, after which cost estimates and quotes will be obtained. A Diocesan loan will be applied for and repaid largely from rent to be received from our second rectory on North Edward, which will become available, hopefully in the fall of 2012 when the McClures move into the primary rectory. Our A.C.W. has pledged a generous donation of \$1,000 to assist with this project! Parishioners also wishing to assist with the cost of the rectory renovations may designate their donations to our Parish GIFT Fund.

A year or so ago, I heard the tragic story of a young man who was a cousin to a family member of ours. He was in his 30's and had worked for the same company for several years. He had dreamed of getting a particular position in this company and when it came available, he applied for it. Unfortunately, it wasn't offered to him, and in fact, he was asked to train the person who did get the job. The Monday morning that this young man was to train the new employee was fast approaching, but it was just too much for him to bear. On the Sunday evening, the night before, this young man shot himself.

Shattered dreams can be tragic. They can get hold of us so badly that they cause us to become depressed, physically ill, or to just give up on life all together. But when people or circumstances bring us down by their words or actions, we must continue to move forward. We must shake off those who would try to defeat us and keep our eyes on the prize, staying focused on our goals. Our destiny is not determined by our dissenters, or critics, or bubble bursters. Our destiny is determined by God. He is the Giver of our dreams and direction. He has the final say.

I don't know if you've ever read any of Bruce Wilkinson's books. He is the author of "The Prayer of Jabez" and "Secrets of the Vine" and "The Dream Giver" to name a few of his books. He shows us how to identify and overcome the obstacles that keep us from living the life that we were created for. In his book, "The Dream Giver," Bruce Wilkinson begins with a modern-day parable about Ordinary, who dares to leave the Land of Familiar to pursue his Big Dream. With the help of the Dream Giver, Ordinary begins the hardest and most rewarding journey of his life. Wilkinson gives us practical, biblical keys to fulfilling our dreams, revealing that there's no limit to what God can accomplish when we choose to pursue the dream He gives us for His honour.

All of us are dreamers to some extent, but some find it easier than others to dream big. But what if we, with God's help, were to dare to dream at the expense of risk and let God be our launching

pad? Would we see and reach places we never thought possible? I think so. Would there be a trail of tears and rocky roads of experience? Most likely. But would there come a day when we would arrive at the destination of our dreams and the pages of our journey would unfold, revealing it's purpose? I believe we would. Are you ready to let God anoint the book of your life and breathe hope into its pages? I hope so. Because the Dream Giver is waiting to hand you over to a waiting world who needs what you have to offer.
